Juvenile Forensic Information

The following information, if available, may be useful for the evaluation of your client:

1. Social history (JFS or other source)
 - a. parent/guardian names, addresses, phone #
 - b. custody information if divorced/foster care/institutionalized
 - c. family/foster care/institutional history
2. Educational history (School or parents/guardian)
 - a. schools (by grade) and performance (report cards if available)
 - b. IEP or 504 placement and written plans
 - c. discipline history and records
3. Work history (if any)
4. Medical history (Primary Care Physician/Pediatrician and/or Parents)
 - a. delivery and/or developmental issues
 - b. prior or present hospitalization history
 - c. current conditions
 - d. current medications
 - e. vision or auditory problems
5. Behavioral health history
 - a. prior psychological evaluations including all records
 - b. prior counseling records
 - c. history of sexual/physical/emotional abuse
 - d. history of alcohol or substance abuse
6. Legal history
 - a. police report, charge, client statement, and related filings for the current offense
 - b. prior offense records
 - c. prior probation reports
 - d. prior competency issues, reports and records
 - e. current incarceration records (if applicable) including adjustment

Contact information and appropriate court orders and/or releases (as necessary) for the following is important:

1. Father/guardian address and phone
2. Mother/guardian address and phone
3. Other relative address and phone if family is unavailable/uncooperative
4. Detention Center/ODYS/Treatment Facility/Group home contact name and phone
5. Behavioral health provider(s) address and phone
